

16-19 Tuition Fund 2021 to 2022

The Department for Education (DfE) has allocated additional funding to support young people aged 16-19 to catch up lost time after school closure. The Post-16 tuition funding is being used to support individual and small group tuition in English, maths, and other courses where learning has been disrupted. Priority is being given to those students who did not achieve grade 4 or above in maths and English GCSE as well as students from economically disadvantaged backgrounds.

Mulberry UTC's Senior Leadership Team and Local Governing Body are accountable for how the catch-up funding is being used. The tuition fund strategy will regularly be reviewed to ensure that the impact is documented. The strategy will be shared with governors and discussed at Local Governing Body meetings during the 2021-2022 academic year and the first meeting of 2022-2023 academic year.

Mulberry UTC have received £42,284 from the ESFA through the 16-19 tuition fund for KS5 students, this fund will be primarily used to fund targeted intervention through small group tuition for:

- Students in Year 12 and Year 13 who are from an economically disadvantaged background, and need additional support where their academic progress and learning has been impacted by Covid-19
- Students in Year 12 and Year 13 who have not achieved a Grade 4 or above in GCSE English Language and/or GCSE Mathematics, including those who are from economically disadvantaged background and need catch-up support
