Student Charter

A 'charter' is the term used to describe the rights that are granted to someone because of their status. At Mulberry UTC, our charter describes the rights granted to our students because they attend the UTC. These rights are listed below, and they are in addition to all the usual rights a student would have in any school. The charter exists so that our students understand the extra provision we make to ensure they leave us as skilled, trained and competent young professionals. That is our duty as a UTC.

Rights often bring with them responsibility. For example, the right to free speech places a duty on us not to spread hate and discrimination through our words. In the same way, our charter gives students the responsibility of volunteering, attending and signing up for the experiences that matter to them. It also requires them to record their experiences in their e-portfolio.

- Participate in 10 school trips that are connected to the world of work and aid your professional growth
- Use specialist equipment related to your courses that is of the same standard as that used in industry
- Apply to join Mulberry Changemakers projects-Mulberry STEM Academy, Mulberry Production Arts Academy and Global Girl Leading

- Participate in Trust-wide enrichment offers for example Model UN, MST sporting events and the Societies programme.
- Attend careers guidance interviews and talks that give you information about the full range of progression opportunities available to you, including apprenticeships
- Take part in volunteering activities in your community that give you the personal and professional skills employers value
- Undertake 5 cross-curricular projects with fellow students that show you how your learning can be applied in the real world
- Record all your experiences in an e-portfolio that you can use for a UCAS personal statement and other career-related applications

T-level in Health T-level in Media, Broadcast and Production

We are now in our second year of delivering the T-level in Health. From September 2024, we will be delivering the T-level in Media, Broadcast and Production. These exciting, industry-focused pathways, give you the chance to gain an industry-relevant qualification, equivalent to three A-levels, which will take you on to university, apprenticeships and beyond.

The **T-level in Health** will give you the knowledge and skills to move into a career in nursing or related areas. In this course, you will learn about:

- · The clinical assessments undertaken by nurses
- · Techniques needed by nurses when working with patients
- · How to create care plans
- · How to support patients to stay healthy

You will spend time being trained in the school's hospital ward and will also make use of the care suite. These fantastic facilities ensure students are well-prepared for the working world. The T-level also includes 45 days of placement in healthcare settings that we deliver in partnership with BARTS Health.

The **T-level in Media, Broadcast and Production** will give you the knowledge and skills to move into a career in the creative media industries, working as a technician in events and venues, or in content creation and production, as well as other related areas. In the this course, you will learn about:

- The creative economy in a range of settings
- The cultural context of varied arts venues and vocabulary linked to place and equipment
- · Audience and consumer needs
- Design briefs and using a broad range of technical equipment across sound, lighting, digital media and film

You will learn using our industry-standard equipment in our purpose-built TV, film, radio studios, theatre studio and theatre. The T-level also includes 45 days of placement in media, broadcast and production venues that we will deliver in partnership with the National Theatre.

T-level entry requirements:

- · At least 5 GCSEs or equivalent at grades 9-4
- · GCSE English and Maths at least grade 4
- · GCSE Science at least 55 for T-level in Health

Level 2

To join Level 2, students must have at least 5 GCSEs at grade 2 or above including English and Maths. If you do not have at least a grade 4 in English and/or Maths GCSE or equivalent, you will be required to retake it.

Students joining Level 2 will follow a oneyear full time programme of study which prepares them to progress to Level 3 study, apprenticeship or skilled employment.

Our Performing and Production Arts students are immersed in the world of theatre, developing industry-standard skills in theatre performance and production. Supported by our partners at the National Theatre, they learn how to succeed as creative professionals within this exciting sector.

Students benefit from working in our beautiful theatre, modelled on the National Theatre's Dorfman Theatre. Designed to the highest specification, it is regularly used by professional and community companies, who deliver workshops and masterclasses to students.

Our studio theatre is a flexible, experimental space in which students are challenged to push creative boundaries. They engage with lighting, sound and video design and operation, stage management, set and costume design.

The experience of Performing and Production Arts students at Mulberry UTC is enriched by workshops and projects with practitioners and placements in professional workplaces. with practitioners and placements in professional workplaces. Health and Social Care students follow courses that prepare them to work in a wide range of health and care roles including nursing, midwifery, social work and childcare.

Health and Social Care students are caring, supportive and helpful. They choose this subject because they want to go on to make a positive difference in the world and in their community. As part of the course, they develop their knowledge of how to work safely in health and care settings, how to communicate effectively, how to deal safely with emergencies and how to work with others effectively.

Students learning about infection control as well as safeguarding and person-centred care. They also have opportunities to learn about caring for young children and older people. Our practical approach gives students the chance to meet practitioners and gain first-hand information about their work. They also take part in work experience with our industry partners, Barts Health NHS Trust, and a wide range of other health practitioners.

Students leave ready to take up crucial roles within health and care including nursing, midwifery, social work, youth work and education. We are extremely proud of the contribution that is made by our health and social care students to supporting the most vulnerable and keeping the community safe and healthy.

During my time at the UTC, I visited many different hospitals and met lots of staff. This helped me realise that there are so many different careers in healthcare and there are lots of different ways to enter a career in the NHS. Networking with midwives at the Royal London Hospital made me realise that I have the skills and motivation to be a successful midwife.

Science and Maths

Our Science and Maths courses are suitable for students who wish to progress to a wide range of careers in science. We also have a 'Future Medics' pathway, for students who are planning to study medicine at university.

Science students learn in our simulated health environments and state-of-the-art science laboratories, developing the knowledge and skills they need for future careers in science and health. They learn to work safely and to control hazards.

Our Applied Science programme is a two year course which combines the study of scientific theory with the development of practical skills. As well as deepening their knowledge and understanding of science and health, students have the opportunity to apply this knowledge in practical contexts. This includes learning how to meet patients' needs in a clinical environment, through working in our simulated hospital ward.

Students following this course develop high-level laboratory skills relevant to a range of science and health work settings. Students deepen their understanding of scientific research and learn how to apply analytical skills in real-world.

Students take part in employer projects linked to areas such as pharmaceuticals, forensics, biotechnology and genetics. Our extracurricular clubs allow students to practise practical skills, including skills training eg. CPR, lab skills, manual blood pressure. There are also opportunities to undertake work experience, as well as trips and monthly seminars delivered by health and science experts.

The UTC working day

The working day at Mulberry UTC reflects a typical working day, to help prepare for the future world of work. The UTC school day starts at 8.40am and finishes at 3.50pm, with an earlier finish at 2.10pm on Fridays.

This longer working day means that we are able to provide a wide range of extension and enrichment opportunities within the school day. We are also able to provide sufficient time for students to complete their studies during the school day, so there is less need for homework.

Uniform and dress code

All students are expected to follow the UTC dress code, which reflects the school's emphasis on the importance of professional, business-like behaviour and attitude. While taking part in technical learning or projects, UTC students follow a different dress code reflecting their particular specialist pathway, including lab coats for Health Science students. 
